#### **GAS LINES**

As a reminder Mountain Villas pays for the natural gas. It is strictly for furnaces, hot water tanks, gas fire places ONLY. Owners are NOT permitted to tap into the gas line for stoves, dryers, grills or hot tubs. This would be a safety liability and would be red flagged from the gas company. This is an HOA requirement as well as a People's Gas regulation.

## **HOMEOWNERS' MEETING**

The Fall HOA meeting at this time is scheduled for November 7th in person at the resort. If anything changes due to Covid-19 restrictions, we may be forced to do another Zoom meeting. But as it stands now, we are in person. Invitations are sent out in October. In order to vote on anything, you would need to attend the meeting in person OR assign your proxy to someone you are comfortable with. This can be your neighbor, member of council, the community manager or anyone else you trust to act in your best interest, and the best interest of the community.

#### FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSPECTIONS

The Mountain Villas will schedule and conduct an inspection of the fire extinguishers in each unit. All condos and townhouses need to have a working fire extinguisher. We will replace and/or recharge them as needed. This cost will be billed to each homeowner individually. If you have a working fire extinguisher, then you will not be billed. I will send out a notice well in advance so that you can have your extinguisher ready. The fire extinguishers in the hall-ways and common areas were inspected in August.

# SAFE AND SECURE

Please make sure you have a working smoke detector and CO-2 in your unit. Remember to turn off your water and adjust your A/C and thermostat accordingly when you are away.



# MOUNTAIN VILLAS COUNCIL MEMBER CANDIDACY CRITERIA

At each Fall Homeowners' Meeting, the election of an Association Council member is an item of business. This year, two council seats will be available. The person receiving the highest number of votes will be elected to a three-year term.

If you are interested in serving your Association as a Council member, please complete and return the statement of candidacy included in this Fall Meeting natice by the due date listed on the statement of candidacy form.

Serving as a Mountain Villas' Council Member is an important part of the organization and, at times, a difficult and time-consuming job. Without the commitment of members who are willing to serve, the Association could not function. Some of the duties of a Council member are to set policies, adopt rules and regulations governing the Association's properties and facilities, and to review and adopt budgets and assessment fees. Council must hold a fiduciary responsibility to the Association, voluntarily agreeing to carry out the responsibility of serving with the utmost degree of good faith, honesty, integrity, and to act in the capacity of a caretaker of homeowners' rights, assets and well being.

Council Members are expected to read and understand the Association documents and policies. He or she should be objective, bringing no personal agendas to the meetings. You might end up on the opposite side of the opinions of your neighbors, friends, or even your spouse. He or she needs to understand the confidentiality of certain Council discussions and decisions and work with the overall good of the organization in mind. The Council is a policy-making, legislative body and should not get into micro-management. There are many issues to review and constructively deal with and all of this is asked of each member on a volunteer basis.

This is an important position and we would like you to take time to seriously consider the commitment involved.
