Parking

Shuttle Bus Service – 2021-2022 Winter Season

Shuttle bus service will be provided on weekends beginning

Sunday, December 21, 2021 through Sunday, January 2, 2022: Service will be provided from 8:00 am to 2:00 am.

Friday, January 7, 2022 and ending Sunday, March 13, 2022 for the following time periods: Friday 6:00 pm to 2:00 am Saturday 7:30 am to 2:00 am and Sunday 7:30 am to 6:00 pm.

If Monday is a Federal holiday, then Saturday's schedule will be repeated on Sunday, and Sunday's schedule will be implemented on Monday.

Outside of the operating hours identified, service will be on an "On-Call" basis.

Shuttle Routes

Mountain Villas – <u>Pick up</u> will be at designated stops on Mt. Villas Road. <u>Drop off</u> points at the resort will be at the Skier Circle and Center Lobby Entrance only.

Additional Operational Requirements

In consideration of the current COVID-19 Pandemic and in order to follow CDC and Pennsylvania Department of Health Guidelines, the following additional requirements will be followed:

Masks are recommended while riding on all shuttles for all persons. Only two (2) guests per seat. Windows may be partially open to allow for additional airflow. All vehicles will be routinely cleaned and disinfected. Hand Sanitizer will be available in each vehicle.

Shuttles will operate continually during service periods; except that they may stop service on occasion due to safety concerns, or the need for maintenance, sanitizing/disinfecting, fuel, or driver relief.

Pet Safety during the Holidays

Turkey

Avoid giving your pet any turkey meat especially fatty dark meat and skin (a small amount of unseasoned white meat is okay) and never give them any leftover bones. Not only are bones a choking hazard, but they can splinter inside your pet's digestive track and cause a trip to the emergency vet.

Garlic, Onion, Leeks, and Chives

These seasonings are common in many holiday dishes and are toxic to dogs and cats - they can cause destruction of their red blood cells. Avoid giving your pet a bite of anything cooked with these ingredients like green beans, potatoes, stuffing, and gravy.

Best Practices

Not only do you not want to give your pets any toxic food, but you want to make sure they don't decide to dive into the trash in search of yummy scraps. Ask family and guests not to feed the dog and make sure your trash can is secure. If at any point your pet ingests something harmful or show signs of illness, call your veterinarian immediately. You can also call the ASPCA pet poison hotline at 888-426-4435 for advice.

Crockpot Hot Chocolate



Everyone loves a delicious cup of hot chocolate. This recipe is easy to make, fun to do with the kiddos, and tastes so great that you'll be upset you didn't make it sooner!

Ingredients:

- 6 Cups Whole Milk
- 14 oz sweetened condensed milk
- 11/2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips Mini Marshmallows

Directions:

- 1. Mix all ingredients in a 6-quart crock pot.
- 2. Cover and cook on low for approx. 2 hours, stirring often during the first hour to make sure the chocolate doesn't settle on the bottom and burn.
- 3 Wait 30 minutes before serving, add marshmallows to the top.

Reindeer Rice Krispie Treats



So easy and so much fun. Kids can decorate their treats with any candy they want!

If you really want to make it easy, get store bought Rice Krispie treats and have fun decorating them with icing, candy, pretzels, etc.

Ingredients:

- 3 Tablespoons butter 1 package (10oz) marshmallows or 4 cups mini marshmallows
 - 6 cups Rice Krispies

Directions:

- 1. Melt butter over low heat in large saucepan
- 2. Add marshmallows and stir until completely melted
- 3. Remove from heat
- 4. Add rice krispies and stir until well coated
- 5. Push mixture into 13x9 pan coated with cooking spray. Mixture will be sticky, so use wax paper or spray a spatula with cooking spray.
- 6 Let cool
- 7. Cut into rectangles
- 8. Decorate!!
